Neighborhood Watch Program



Although Agoura Hills is one of the safest communities in California, complacency can be a bad thing that costs us all money and unwanted headaches. One way to help avoid that and to protect your neighborhood even further is to start a Neighborhood Watch Program.

Criminal gangs have become more sophisticated over time and have elaborate schemes to see who is home on particular days or to gain access to your home under the guise of a salesman/woman so they can scope out your home and valuables ahead of time. Having extra eyes and ears in your neighborhood helps reduce the likelihood that you and your neighbors will be targets.

The City of Agoura Hills has consolidated with the County of Los Angeles for the upcoming election. Are You Registered to Vote?

You may register to vote in Agoura Hills if you are a U.S. citizen, are at least 18 years of age (or will be by the date of the next election), not in prison or on parole for conviction of a felony, and not been judged by a court to be mentally incompetent to register and vote. If you have not registered, if you have registered and recently changed your name or address, a voter registration form may be picked up at the City Clerk's Office in City Hall, the Agoura Hills Library, and the U.S. Post Office located at 5158 Clareton Drive in Agoura Hills. Your voter registration form must be filled out completely and postmarked or hand-delivered to the County of Los Angeles Elections Division (in Norwalk) at least 15 days before the election.

IMPROVEMENTS TO CANWOOD STREET, NEARING COMPLETION

The City Public Works staff is proud to display the work that has been completed on Canwood up to this point, and as the project nears completion; the whole community is invited to enjoy the newly repaired and repaved roadway and sidewalks.

Reconstruction of Canwood Street included pavement restoration, using both Cold In-Place Recycle and Rubberized Asphalt Overlay, and slope stabilization of the south side of Canwood Street, from Forest Cove to just east of Strawberry Hill. Slope stabilization of Canwood Street included installation of soldier piles along the south side of the street, under existing sidewalk, which required reconstruction of curb, gutter and sidewalk.

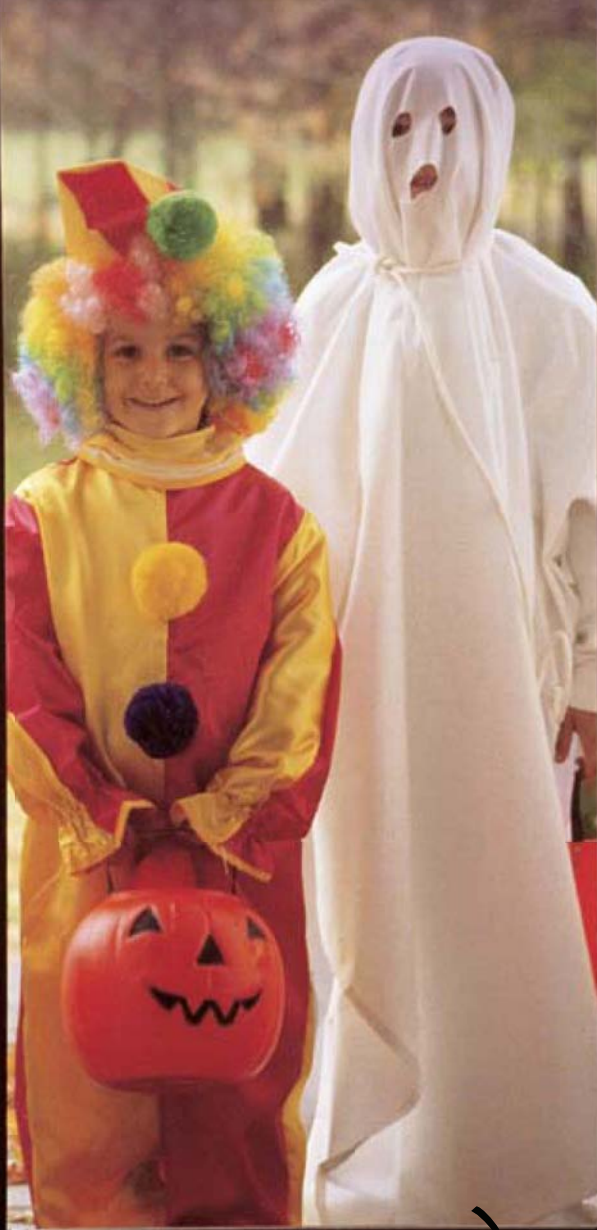


Additionally, various areas of Canwood, including the south side of Canwood, from Forest Cove to just east of Strawberry Hill, required Full-Depth Pavement Reconstruction, which included installation of new road base and asphalt pavement. And, finally, the Project included street widening of Canwood, just east of the Fire Station, providing new curb, gutter, sidewalk and street travel lane.

This project is included as part of the Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority's (Metro) Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP), which was approved by the Metro Board on October 29, 2009, and is guaranteed funding as part of Metro's priority list for the projects funded within the first ten years by Measure R. 🌱

Have Fun, BE SAFE During The Holidays

The "Trick or Treating" season is officially here once again, and while you may be busy planning to visit the neighborhoods that hand out the most candy, or deciding on what costume to wear this year, we would like to take a quick opportunity to remind both adults and kids of a few safety tips to ensure a fun and exciting Halloween for everyone:



Tips for Adults:

1. Know the route your kids will be taking if you aren't going with them.
2. The best bet is to make sure that an adult is going with them. If you can't take them, see if another parent or a responsible teen-aged sibling can go along.
3. Know what other activities a child may be attending, such as parties, school or mall functions.
4. Make sure you set a time that they should be home by. Make sure they know how important it is for them to be home on time.
5. If your kids are young, check all their candy before they eat ANY of it. Discard of any candy that looks tampered with or previously opened.

Tips for Kids:

1. Help your child pick out or make a costume that will be safe. Make it fire proof, the eye holes should be large enough for good peripheral vision.
2. If you set jack-o-lanterns on your porch with candles in them, make sure that they are far enough out of the way so that kids' costumes won't accidentally be set on fire.
3. Make sure that if your child is carrying a prop, such as a butcher knife or a pitchfork, that the tips are smooth and flexible enough to not cause injury if fallen on.
4. Kids always want to help with the pumpkin carving. Small children shouldn't be allowed to use a sharp knife to cut the top or the face. There are many kits available that come with tiny saws that work better than knives and are safer, although you can be cut by them as well. It's best to let the kids clean out the pumpkin and draw a face on it, which you can carve for them.

In addition to these helpful tips, please note that to ensure the safety of residents and visitors to the annual Halloween festivities on Hempstead Drive, all access points will be closed (open only to pedestrians and/or residents who will need to present verifiable identification) on Thursday, October 31, between the hours of 5pm through 9pm. You can view the City's website at www.ci.agoura-hills.ca.us to see an exhibit of the closure locations and special route for large vehicles (ie: vanpools, buses, etc). You may also visit the Public Works and Engineering Department at City Hall and our staff can assist you in understanding the planned traffic control.
