SUBJECT:

ADOPT AMENDMENTS TO FISCAL YEAR 2013/14 CITY OF

AGOURA HILLS BUDGET

Annually, following year-end, an audit is conducted, as required by law. Auditors review a variety of items, including accuracy of projected budgets, transactions, and proper use of restricted funds.

The request before the Council is to consider the amendments to the Fiscal Year 2013/14 City of Agoura Hills (City) budget, as shown on Exhibit 'A'. The recommended amendments have been presented to the Finance Committee and are recommended for consideration.

General Fund

Unaudited General Fund revenues are 104% of the amended budget:

The majority of increased revenues came from three sources: Sales and Use Tax (\$144,500); Transient Occupancy Tax (\$131,000); Building Permits (\$25,500) and Encroachment Permits (\$43,200).

Fiscal Year 2013/14 amended General Fund budget for expenditures and transfers is shown as follows:

The Fiscal Year 2013/14 General Fund budget included a \$50,202 surplus. However, with the increased revenues and decreased expenditure/transfers, General Fund was \$517,795 under budget.

Consistent with previous City Council direction, staff respectfully recommends transfers from the General Fund to the Stormwater Capital Projects Fund, for use on future mandated projects, and to the Recreation Center Capital Project Fund, to complete further enhancements on the project. The recommended amounts are shown on Exhibit "A". After the recommended transfers, reserve levels are projected to be at 69% of operating expenses and transfers.

The City utilizes a departmental budget process, breaking out various functions of city operations to allow for a transparent budget for the community to see and understand. Operational expenses were under budget in Fiscal Year 2013/14 by \$63,911, but various departments within the General Fund exceeded budgeted appropriations, as explained in Exhibit "A". These costs were offset by a like amount of savings in other departments. The total increases to the eleven departments are \$214,816 and are summarized below:

Finance

This division exceeded their budget by \$16,864, or 5%, due to increased sales tax audit findings. The City's sales tax consultant found several findings, which resulted in increased sales tax to the City for fiscal year 2013/14. This is the offsetting cost of the audit.

Public Facilities

The Public Facilities division exceeded their budget by \$9,849, or 3%, primarily due to increased utility costs at the Civic Center.

Non-Departmental

Increased costs for professional services in the amount of \$4,191, or 1%, due to additional costs for services by Patton & Boggs.

Emergency Operations

The Emergency Operations division exceeded their budget by \$1,079, or 8%, due to FCC narrow banding, which was a required upgrade to the repeater. Staff received the estimates for the necessary equipment and labor after the budget was submitted.

Recreation

Increased costs for recreation courses \$4,227, or 1%, due to greater participation in courses. This was offset by increased revenues to Recreation Fees.

Parks Maintenance

The Parks Maintenance division exceeded their budget by \$27,110, or 7%, due to increased water rates and usage.

Public Works Administration

The Public Works department exceeded their operational budget by \$59,391, or 13%, due to the fact that the overlay project slated for the end of June was delayed until the first of July. This project would distribute cost administering the project to the Proposition C Fund. The project will decrease costs in the General Fund in 2014/15.

Traffic Safety

This division exceeded their operational budget by \$14,199 or 68%. This primarily relates to accidental damage to City property (i.e.: monument signs, park equipment, etc.) that exceeded our budget for repairs. These accidents are billed for restitution, and offsetting revenues will be recorded if they are collected.

Landscape Maintenance

Landscape maintenance exceeded their budget by \$14,985, or 12%, due to increased water rates and usage.

Storm Drain & Flood Control

The completion of a water quality master plan in 2013/14 led to a \$60,840 budget variance, or 27%. The plan was originally anticipated to be completed in 2012/13, but was finished in 2013/14.

Transfers Out

Transfers out for the new 2013 debt service exceeded the budget by \$2,081, or 1%. This was to cover the cost of trustee services and was not anticipated in the original budget.

Various other Funds had expenditure adjustments in various divisions. These funds are as follows:

Storm Water Capital Projects Fund

The cost of storm drain inserts exceeded the budget by \$1,482, or 1%.

Traffic Improvements Fund

Work on the Agoura Road Widening Canwood Street Improvements exceeded the budget by \$26,277. This project was not originally anticipated in the 2013/14 budget year.

Miscellaneous Grants Fund

The Medea Creek Naturalization cost of \$87,165 was not included in the original budget. These costs are offset by a grant.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff respectfully recommends the City Council adopt the proposed amendments to the Fiscal Year 2013/14 Budget for the amounts shown in Exhibit "A".
