AGOURA ROAD Widening Project



To meet future planned growth, the City has initiated a project to widen a 2.2 mile stretch of Agoura Road from two to four lanes between the City's westerly limits and Kanan Road. When completed, the project will improve traffic flow, create a consistent design that is compatible with the existing roadway, and improve the roadway's function to serve as an emergency alternative to the U.S. Highway 101. This is a Measure R project fully funded by Metro.





Construction Schedule START DATE: Early 2015 COMPLETION: Early 2016

Project Highlights

- Widening Agoura Road from two to four lanes.
- Construction of landscaped medians, sidewalks, a pedestrian-only bridge over Medea Creek, and dedicated bike lanes in both directions
- Installation of decorative street lights along the improved roadway
- Undergrounding the electrical power lines

- Improving local traffic flow
- Providing an emergency bypass for the U.S. Highway 101
- Increasing safety for pedestrians, cyclists and recreationists
- Enhancing the roadway's visual appearance
