SUBJECT: CONTRACT AWARD FOR THE FY2015-16 STREET RESURFACING PROJECT; NIB 15-02

On April 22, 2015, the City Council authorized staff to seek bids for the FY 2015-16 Street Resurfacing Project; NIB 15-02. The scope of work consists of resurfacing 18 residential streets located in the northeast section of the City and some streets adjacent to Agoura High School with Rubberized Asphalt Concrete (RAC) and Asphalt Concrete (AC). The use of RAC provides our City streets several advantages over conventional asphalt concrete, such as increased resistance to reflective cracking, providing a quieter ride, and better striping contrast; all while recycling used tires.

In addition to the residential streets, the project includes slurry sealing & striping the City Hall and Agoura Hills/Calabasas Community Center parking lots, as well as a localized repair near the intersection of Kanan Road and Hillrise Drive, and the removal & reconstruction of 47 ADA Curb Ramps.

On June 16, 2015, the City received three (3) sealed bids for the project. The bid results were as follows:

Staff reviewed the bid submittal of the apparent low bidder, All American Asphalt and deemed their bid responsive and acceptable. All American Asphalt has completed previous City overlay projects to the satisfaction of staff.

The FY 2015-16 project budget includes \$20,000 from the Proposition C, \$237,000 from Measure R Local Return Funds, \$122,540 from converted STP-L funds, \$288,500 from Gas Tax funds, \$74,500 from Recycled Asphalt Grant funds, \$30,000 from the General Fund, \$13,552 from TDA funds, and \$60,000 from sidewalk repair funds. Total funds budgeted for the project is \$846,092. Construction is planned to start in late July, and once started, the project is anticipated to take approximately 30 days to complete with no work to be done on holidays.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff respectfully recommends the City Council:

1. Award the contract for the FY 2015-16 Street Resurfacing Project; NIB 15-02 to All American Asphalt and;
2. Authorize the Mayor to sign the contract agreement.
