SUBJECT: APPROVAL OF UPDATED SANITARY SEWER MANAGEMENT PLAN

(SSMP), AS REQUIRED BY STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL

BOARD ORDER NO. 2006-003

On July 8, 2009, the City Council approved the City's Sanitary Sewer Management Plan (SSMP), as required by Order No. 2006-003, which was adopted by the State Water Resources Control Board. The regulations were developed due to a growing concern about the water quality impacts of sanitary sewer overflows, particularly those that cause beach closures or pose serious health and safety problems.

The SSMP sets forth goals and guidelines for managing, operating, maintaining, repairing, replacing and expanding the sewer system. Since the Consolidated Sewer Maintenance District (CSMD) of the Los Angeles County Sewer Maintenance Districts (SMD) provides operation and maintenance services for the City's sewer facilities, some components of the City's SSMP are the same as those of the SMD SSMP.

The SSMP is intended to be a living document which must be periodically updated to reflect current conditions and knowledge of the system. Pursuant to the order, the updated SSMP must be approved by the City Council (copy is on file in the office of the City Clerk).

Staff has worked closely with the SMD and Willdan Engineering to prepare the Updated SSMP, and deem it complete as addressing all requirements of the order.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff respectfully recommends the City Council approve the Updated Sanitary Sewer Management Plan.
