SUBJECT: 2015 GENERAL PLAN HOUSING ELEMENT ANNUAL PROGRESS

REPORT

The purpose of this item is to provide the City Council with the General Plan Housing Element *Annual Element Progress Report* (APR) for 2015, and direct staff to forward the attached report to the California Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD).

Government Code Section 65400 establishes the requirement that each city and county prepare an annual report on the status of the Housing Element, and progress in its implementation, to HCD. State law also requires that the APR be reviewed by the legislative body (City Council) at a public meeting. The City Council adopted the City's *General Plan 2035* in March 2010, and the *2013-2021 Housing Element* in August 2013. HCD certified the Housing Element in September 2013.

As noted in the APR, many of the implementation measures of the Housing Element are ongoing, and some will need to be completed this coming year to meet the goals outlined in the Housing Element. Staff is currently completing a draft zoning ordinance amendment to revise the Inclusionary Housing Program guidelines, to reflect current market conditions and recent court decisions regarding applicability to rental units. This ordinance will be considered by the Planning Commission and City Council in 2016.

The APR indicates that 15 single-family homes were built in 2015. These include 13 single-family homes as part of Williams Homes' second phase of development (formerly known as Riopharm), and two single-family homes in Old Agoura. To be considered built, a Certificate of Occupancy must be issued. All 15 dwelling units built in 2015 were for above-moderate income households.

Upon authorization of the City Council, staff will forward the 2015 Annual Element Progress Report to HCD.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends the City Council authorize staff to forward the 2015 Annual Element Progress Report to the California Department of Housing and Community Development.
