REPORT OF CLOSED SESSION

City Attorney Steele reported on the Closed Session pursuant to Government Code Section 54956.8. Direction was given to staff and no reportable action was taken.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

On a motion by Councilmember Kuperberg, second by Councilmember Edelston, the Agenda was approved without objection.

ORAL COMMUNICATIONS

Gale Trumbeaux, 28311 Agoura Road, Agoura Hills, representing Stage Door, expressed her concerns with the adult entertainment at the Blue nightclub. She requested to be notified when the entertainment permit was up for review.

City Manager Ramirez provided an update indicating that the owners have been contacted regarding the adult entertainment and noted that this is a County permitted establishment, but the City would be involved in the upcoming County recertification.

Joan Yacovone, 27328 Country Glen, Agoura Hills, commended staff on the Reyes Adobe Days events and requested the Liberty Canyon HOA also be notified in relation to the renewal of the entertainment permit for the Blue nightclub.

PRESENTATIONS

INTERGOVERNMENTAL, SPECIAL PURPOSE COMMITTEE & DEPARTMENTAL REPORTS

Assistant Fire Chief Reginald C. Lee, Fire Station 70, Los Angeles County Fire Department, and Captain Thomas G. Martin, Malibu/Lost Hills Sheriff's Station each provided an update on emergency preparedness efforts for the City and neighboring areas, in relation to the Topanga Fire, and the benefits of a unified command in an emergency situation.

11. Discussion Regarding Landscaped Parkways and Meandering Sidewalks

Joan Yacovone, 27328 Country Glen, Agoura Hills, noted that people who are interested in running or walking cannot use meandering sidewalks.

John Malone, representative from NextG Networks of California, Inc., provided an overview of services and equipment.

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Councilmember Reinhardt wished everyone a Happy Halloween, encouraged residents to vote on November 8, 2005, and reported that the public hearing of the Regional Water Quality Control Board, related to the renewal of the water permit for the Tapia Water Treatment Plant, had been continued to 1:30 p.m. on November 3, 2005, at Simi Valley City Hall.
