Using Technology to Simplify the Bidding Process

The City has implemented a new e-Procurement system in conjunction with PlanetBids. This system now streamlines procurement processes and offers expanded services to all vendors by allowing them to participate in City procurements via the internet.

PLANET BIDS

PlanetBids is a comprehensive, fully-integrated e-Procurement tool specifically designed to meet the procurement needs of the City. Within PlanetBids, purchasing functions are seamlessly integrated with each other; purchasing data flows from requisitions to solicitations, award, and to contracts in a highly-automated manner.

Get started and register your company as an interested vendor, just go to the City's website www.ci.agoura-hills.ca.us and click on the Business subtitle and then click Current Bids and Requests for Qualifications/Proposals.

Key Features Include:

- ▶ Bid opportunities from the City are posted to a new consolidated bid board.
- ▶ Electronically submit bids or proposals.
- ▶ Improved vendor registration process. Vendors will be able to define areas of business by use of widely-accepted National Institute of Government Purchasing (NIGP) commodity codes; Provide detailed regulatory registrations and certifications; Identify "emergency services" capability, etc.
- ▶ View the City's award results online.
- ▶ Vendors can set up and self manage certificate of insurance.
- ▶ Vendors will receive automatic email notifications for bid opportunities relevant to the NIGP codes of products or services offered by their company.
- ▶ Both the City and its vendors benefit from material reduction in the amount of paperwork, time, and expense involved in the bid and award process.
- ▶ PlanetBids provides tutorial guides within each module intended to help users navigate through the PB system with ease and efficiency.

The PlanetBids program offers some great features that allow the City and interested vendors to communicate online.

Bid Opportunities
Search for bid opportunities with this agency, download documents, become a prospective bidder, and electronically bid on projects.

Saving Water...

Where the Indoors and Outdoors Meet

Up to 70% of your annual water use is outside your home... watering your lawn and garden, and keeping your property clean. Landscaping with native and drought-tolerant plants, will use less water and be more resistant to local plant diseases.

The drought hasn't subsided and we all need to try and do our part to conserve the precious water that we do have. Below are some tips to save on your water usage inside and outside your home.

How to Reduce Water Outdoors?

- Check your sprinkler system for leaks, overspray and broken sprinkler heads and repair promptly. Also, avoid watering on windy days.
- Install a smart sprinkler controller that adjusts watering based on weather, soil type, amount of shade and plant type.
- Water your plants in the early morning or evening to reduce evaporation.
- Consider obtaining a rain barrel (can save up to 600 gallons/year).
- Use a pool cover to reduce water loss due to evaporation.
- Allow your grass to reach at least three inches in length before cutting, which encourages deeper root growth and increases water retention.

How to Reduce Water Indoors?

- Wash only full loads of laundry and dishes.
- Fix household leaks promptly.
- Turn off the water while you brush your teeth.
- Use excess or leftover ice cubes to water houseplants.
- Buy water-saving devices like high-efficiency toilets and clothes washers. Some of these clothes washers are eligible for rebates!

Conserving water use inside your home is as simple as turning off the faucet. The practice of using water efficiently reduces unnecessary water usage and saves money on your water bill. 🌱

BEACH BUS 2018

Hit the Beach this summer with the Agoura Hills Beach Bus! The Beach Bus runs on Monday - Friday from June 18 - August 17 to Zuma Beach Station #5. No bus service 7/4. Pick up points are Lindero Canyon Middle School, Agoura High School, and the south-east corner of Liberty Canyon/Agoura Road. Beach Bus is just \$2 each way to Zuma Beach Station #5!

Leo Carrillo Junior Guards Beach Bus Pass is for Leo Carrillo Junior Guards only, and costs \$50 (plus the \$2 each way for each day). Leo Carrillo JG Program runs Monday - Friday from July 2 - August 10, 2018.

No bus service 7/4. You must be enrolled in the Leo Carrillo Junior

Lifeguard Program to ride this bus. Morning stops are: Lindero

Canyon Middle School at 7:50am, Agoura High School at 8:00am, and

the south/east corner of Liberty Canyon/Agoura Road at 8:10am,

arriving at Leo Carrillo State Park at 9:00am. Afternoon stops are:

leaving Leo Carrillo at 2:00pm and arriving at the south/east

corner of Liberty Canyon/Agoura Road at 2:50pm, at Agoura High

School at 3:00pm, and Lindero Canyon Middle School at 3:10pm.

All times are approximate and depend on beach traffic.

Your Online Identity is Precious, Make Sure to PROTECT IT

You will never have more ideas about how to protect your identity than the few minutes after you realize that it's been stolen. We all make sure we lock and alarm the front door to our homes but carelessly post sensitive information online that for all intent purposes is the key to our online accounts. Now it isn't all our fault... there are some sophisticated hackers out there and there are some well-known companies who haven't protected consumers' private information that well. Therefore, while it may not always be our fault, it is still our responsibility to protect ourselves. 🌿

HERE ARE SOME OF THE BEST WAYS TO PROTECT YOURSELF:

🔒 Don't play social media games – these are notorious security holes as some of your answers require you to provide personal information and while it may seem like fun and games, you are in essence giving thieves exactly what they need to take over your identity.

🔒 Don't accept friend requests from people you don't know – Every time you accept a “friend” request, you allow that individual to access every post you have ever made. It's safe to say, there are probably several things that clue in thieves to who you are and information about your life that they can find useful.

🔒 Avoid online quizzes – Not only do these quizzes request you to list personal information, they may ask you to authenticate your account by logging into Facebook or another social media account. If you do take these quizzes, at minimum check the URL and make sure it's from a reputable source.

🔒 Properly manage your passwords – Use strong passwords and if possible, randomly generated passwords. At a minimum, avoid using information about yourself. Never reuse passwords between multiple sites. Examples of password managers that can be utilized to assist you are KeePass, LastPass and Dashline.

🔒 When possible, use two-factor authentication – Having the strongest passwords isn't enough anymore to keep hackers out of your information, you should enable a two-factor authentication. When you log in, you could get a one-time passcode or you can even use an authenticator app such as Google Authenticator.

🔒 Make sure you look before you click – make sure websites start with HTTPS, which indicates that the web page is secure. Phishing or malicious emails often look like credible emails. Make sure you check the sender's email and insure that you recognize it. Are there spelling mistakes in the email? Does the link you see make sense based on the context of your discussions or relationships with the sender?

The Department of Community Services would like to take this opportunity to remind community members of some "Park Rules" that exist to help us keep our parks clean and safe.

Staff would like to first, remind people to remember to clean up after yourselves, your children and even your pets, when done using the parks. Each park conveniently has many trashcans and "Mutt Mitt" stations for you to pick up after your dog. Dog waste is not natural fertilizer and carries a lot of bacteria and possibly parasites that could be harmful to other animals and humans. It doesn't easily wash away with water and is not only an inconvenience to step in for other patrons but actually causes water quality issues.

Also, please remember that your dog must remain on their leash while in the park. In order to ensure the safety of those visiting and playing in our parks, particularly little children, we ask that dogs remain on their leashes. Please also be mindful of smoking prohibitions within the parks, as well as on the grounds of the Recreation and Event Center, City Hall and Library.
