

COVID-19 UPDATES

(1/13/21)

Los Angeles County Department of Public Health

- County Health continues to see rising confirmed cases
- Now is the time to avoid, as much as possible, contact with others that are not in your household
- When you must go out, to work or for essential services, always wear a mask, keep your distance from others, wash your hands frequently
- Over 944,319 confirmed COVID cases (1/12/21)
- 1/13/21 14,564 new cases of COVID-19
- 1/13/21 There are 7,949 people with COVID-19 currently hospitalized and 22% of these people are in the ICU
- The County has gone from an average of 791 people hospitalized with COVID-19 two months ago to an average of around 8,000 patients. More than 1,000% increase

Vaccine Information

- Phased distribution plans, including who would be eligible to receive the vaccine can be viewed at: <u>http://publichealth.lacounty.gov/acd/ncorona2019/covidvaccinedistribution/</u>
- As of last week, countywide hospitals received 220,000 COVID-19 vaccine doses and vaccinated 160,000 healthcare workers; about 75% completion rate (Phase 1)
- More than 75 vaccination locations have been established to facilitate the administration of doses to individuals within these tiers. More locations to come as the distribution of the vaccine increases
- Governor Gavin Newsome announced that California residents 65 years and older are now eligible to receive the vaccine. Information on the State's vaccination efforts can be found here: <u>https://covid19.ca.gov/vaccines/#When-can-I-get-vaccinated</u>
