



COVID-19 Vaccine

Getting a Second Dose

In LA County, every resident is guaranteed a second dose of COVID-19 vaccine

When to get your second dose

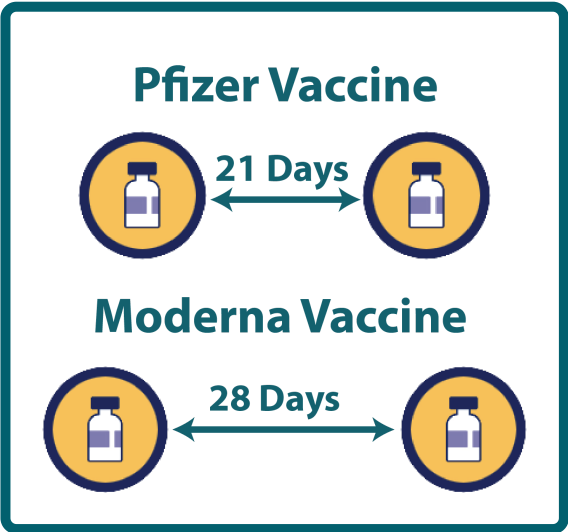
You need 2 doses of vaccine to get the most protection:

- Pfizer-BioNTech doses should be given 3 weeks (21 days) apart
- Moderna doses should be given 4 weeks (28 days) apart

Your second dose should be given as close to this recommended interval as possible. However, if this is not possible, the second dose may be given up to 6 weeks (42 days) after the first dose.

What to bring to the appointment

Remember to bring your white vaccine record card or electronic vaccine record AND a photo ID. Long Term Care Facility Residents should bring their vaccine referral letter.



How you get your second dose depends on where you got your first dose:

Public Health - Large-Scale Vaccination Sites (Drive-Through Mega-PODs)

Your appointment for your second dose will be **21** days later at the same **LOCATION** as your first dose.

How to get your second dose

- Your appointment for your second dose will be 21 days later at the same location as your first dose (this may be written on the back of your white vaccination card).
- You will receive an email confirming the place and date of your second dose appointment - **please respond to confirm the time of the appointment.**
- We strongly encourage you to keep your appointment. In a rare instance where you must reschedule (for instance if you have an emergency) please contact Public Health on the email address that will be provided.

If you have received or will receive a MODERNA vaccination at one of the following sites:

Your appointment for your second dose will be 28 days later at the SAME or the closest LOCATION.

You will receive an email confirmation with your appointment date and to book your time.

Where to get your second dose

Most people will receive their second doses at the same location they received their first dose, with a few small differences, as a few sites have closed:

- People vaccinated at Ritchie Valens will now get their second dose at Balboa.
- People vaccinated at Hazard/Belvedere will get their second dose at El Sereno.

How to get your second dose

- Your appointment for your second dose will be 21 days later at the same location as your first dose (this may be written on the back of your white vaccination card).
- You will receive an email confirming the place and date of your second dose appointment - **please respond to confirm the time of the appointment.**
- We strongly encourage you to keep your appointment. In a rare instance where you must reschedule (for instance if you have an emergency) please contact Public Health on the email address that will be provided.

How to get your second dose

You will receive an email and text from Carbon Health with information about your second appointment. The emails will be sent over a 2 week period starting on 1-30-21. People whose second appointments are due earlier will be prioritized for notification.

How to get your second dose

Please contact the provider or site where you were vaccinated if you have not heard from them about your second dose appointment. They will be able to give you information confirming that appointment.

Note: You can schedule an appointment yourself through the appointment [webpage](#)*, but please be aware:

- *Appointments can be difficult to find* due to limited vaccine supply.
- *The same type of vaccine should be used for both doses.* Only make an appointment at a location that is offering the same vaccine as your 1st dose. If you do not remember which vaccine you got, look at your white vaccine record card, electronic vaccine record or referral letter. Then look at the table on the [appointment page](#) to see which locations offer which vaccine.

**If you have a disability or have difficulty using a computer, you can use the Call Center. Call 1-833-530-0473 between the hours of 8am and 8:30pm. We are expanding capacity at the call center but please note that there are long wait times. You can leave your number and get a call back within 24-36 hours.
