Climate Action & Adaptation Plan

The City of Agoura Hills is committed to reducing greenhouse gas emissions and enhancing the community resilience towards vulnerabilities and risks posed by climate change.

The goal of the Climate Action and Adaptation Plan (CAAP) is to develop policies and programs to reduce reliance on fossil fuels, provide cost savings to residents, and use energy more efficiently.

The City accepted public comments throughout January and February regarding the draft CAAP, culminating in open discussions regarding the plan's direction at two City Council Meetings on February 10, 2021 and February 24, 2021. The City Council, along with its staff is working to complete Phase 1 and present the final draft at the City Council Meeting on March 10, 2021. The next phase will take 3-4 months to complete CEQA compliance. 🌿

Agoura Village Specific Plan

In a regular meeting of the Agoura Hills City Council on January 27, 2021, members of the Agoura Village Specific Plan Update Citizen Advisory Group (CAG) were appointed. This group represents is comprised of ten (10) community members, one (1) Planning Commissioner, and two (2) City Councilmembers.

The first meeting of the CAG was on Tuesday, February 23, and future meetings are tentatively scheduled to occur bi-monthly. The CAG meetings will be broadcasted live as webinars, and the public is encouraged to

Linear Park Design Picking up Speed

The City of Agoura Hills has reached a milestone in the design of the Agoura Hills Linear Park, the public review period of the CEQA document.

We're happy to share the conceptual layout with the public and are preparing to submit an application to the State Park Program to seek funding for construction.

You'll notice the parks elements include a child play area, horse trail and hitching stations, "butterfly walk" paths, native planting, an informal amphitheater area, and game area that may include elements like horseshoes, bocce ball, chess tables and more. Chesebro Bridge Nearing Completion

The improvements included widening the existing overcrossing from 40 feet to 76 feet to accommodate one travel lane in each direction and a left-turn lane, constructing sidewalks, and installing a signal at the northbound off-ramp. Landscaping elements are being installed and renowned artist Joe Wertheimer is working to complete the painting and shading of the bridge. It's exciting to see the project taking shape, and we expect the project completion by April with some
