Subject: May 10th Council Meeting - Short and Long Term Goals and Budget Considerations
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Dear Mayor and City Council members,

Thank you for your consideration of the three items below as part of your short and long term budget and policy goals.

(1). Cities throughout the state are considering Community Resilience Hubs or Community Resource Centers to provide residents and businesses a building that would be available 24-7 in times of power shuts offs, extreme heat events, wildfires or other emergencies. I would suggest that the Agoura Hills/Calabasas(and LA County) Community Center and other public buildings in Agoura Hills be considered. With the need for a new roof on the Community Center, a roof with solar panels along with batter storage capability, would meet that goal of potentially providing power for communications, EV and cell hone recharging, a safe refuge, etc. Being adjacent to the Lost Hills Sheriffs Station and a bus stop on Agoura Road is beneficial too. The two cities emergency command centers could be located there when needed, and have the City's new mobile communication trailer(SMMC grant) stored there, too.

Many of the fires that have jumped the 101 between Mureau Road and Chesebro Road tend to be driven by Santa Ana winds through the canyons towards Malibu. This community resource center could be up and going for this fall. Grants may be available through the CEC, PUC, or the SMMC, etc. Your budget should make the Community Center as a priority.

2). Please consider the establishment of a microgrid in the AVSP. Solar, plus storage on new the roofs of buildings or over parking lots will provide power and an important resource, investment, and perhaps a draw for operating hotels, restaurants, EV charging stations etc. This would also be consistent with the City's Climate Action and Adaptation Plan. As you know the State's target is for only EV's or ZEV's to be sold in California by 2035 and for net zero energy in all new buildings. Transitioning now would be a smart idea. Ted Barnacke with the So Cal Clean Power Authority, SCE, the Sustainability Office in LA County, could be helpful. Its always more expensive to have to retrofit later.

3) Agoura Hills, the Gateway to the Santa Monica Mts, is our logo. Let's celebrate that, especially south of Agoura Road. Pathways along the three sections of creeks(Medea and Chesebro Creeks south of Agoura Road), and the "flood channel' between Whizens and Cornell Road with only native plants and oaks or sycamores, and clean water flowing through the watershed. A consultant could be hired to provide a conceptual plan for these three watercourses with walking paths. County Measure W and State funds for watersheds and water quality may be available.(I can help with those). This could be a great draw and an important resource. Please coordinate with the LVMWD, RCD and SMMC. A few welcoming kiosks with

information on the Santa Monica Mountains would be a welcomed addition. Redesign the proposed buildings south of Agoura Road to provide viewsheds of the mountains. Coordinate with the SMMC to acquire and preserve Triangle Ranch and the stepper portions of the old Cornerstone project. Three story mixed use buildings on the north side of Agoura Road may be considered, too.
