# American Rescue Plan Act 2021 Update

- City of Agoura Hills estimated to receive \$3.8 million in 2 installments of approximately \$1.9 million (expected June 2021 & June 2022)
- All funds must be utilized by December 2024
- Guidelines released this week (151 page document)
- Use of Funds (What we do know via approved legislation)
  - COVID-19 emergency & effects
  - Government services effected, including workforce losses
  - Investments in sewer, water, or broadband infrastructure
  - No pension funds

# Comments from City Treasurer

# Rule 20A Funds

- City has allotted funds collected and maintained by SCE to underground utility poles (electrical service)
- Annual allocation of approximately \$23,600
- Currently have \$1.3 million (estimated to receive approx. \$700,000)
- Recommendation from Finance Subcommittee:
  - Seek proposals from other agencies to exchange for unrestricted
     General Funds
  - Use of funds to be determined by City Council when received
  - Consider local beautification projects such as parks, infrastructure, and/or utilize for reserve fund balance

### Community Services

(Parks/Landscape/Transportation)

- Agoura Hills/Calabasas Community Center funding (roof, operations, other repairs) – Discuss and provide direction
- Agoura Hills 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Recognition *Include in a City event for FY 2022-23 (\$30,000)*
- Additional park enhancements (restrooms, benches, landscaping)
   included in preliminary budget
- Morrison Park play equipment request Design analysis and assistance, if private parties can fundraise, possibly consider City contribution in FY 2022-23

### Community Services

(Parks/Landscape/Transportation)

- New Liberty Canyon Park
- HOA requests to maintain/re-landscape private property areas –
  included landscape medians on Thousand Oaks boulevard, removing
  palm trees and re-landscaping private slope near Chumash Park, private
  walls. Discussion included liability for private property and possible gift of
  public funds issues

### AHCCC

#### (Agoura Hills Calabasas Community Center)

Options Menu:

#### #1: Building closed for operations - No roof repair

 Financial obligations include basic building maintenance/operations with no major repair (Contribution \$92,000/year)

#### #2: Roof repair (gymnasium) with building closed

 Includes one year of basic building maintenance/operations with a closed building and roof repair (\$300,000), expected contribution for misc. repairs and operations for FY 2022-23 (\$200,000)

#3: No financial contribution beyond liability expenses (\$50,000/year) and discuss future of JPA with Calabasas

### Communications

- Streamline Emergency notifications sign-up FY 2021-22 (\$25,000) for both items (website & Code Red)
- Expedite fixes on website calendar, news, search feature (combined)
- Add part-time or full-time Public Information Officer/professional Utilize consultant for FY 2021-22 & 2022-23 (\$80,000/year) & look to train staff to grow into position
- Mayor's Outreach program discuss re-implementing (\$5,000)

# Public Works (Infrastructure)

- Continue working on Linear Park (design, water quality features, funding) Seek grant and special funds for construction
- Liberty Canyon Street & Landscape Master Plan L.A. County proposed project,
   consider FY 2022-23 funding if project does not move forward (\$50,000)
- Increase/Enhance bike facilities (dedicated lanes, racks, and expand trails for biking) phased approach (1) Complete Bicycle Master Plan/VMT Bank via Prop C (\$80,000) (2) Allocate funding to apply to items identified (up to \$150,000)
- Agoura Hills signage along U.S. 101 approach owner, consider cooperative effort to enhance sign – FY 2021-22 (\$10,000)

# Public Works (Infrastructure)

- Address flooding issue on Driver Ave. at Agoura High School
- Walking path & beautification from Kanan Rd. to Thousand Oaks Blvd.
   (Behind Von's Center)
- Agoura Hills signage U.S. 101 @ Palo Comado

# **Environmental Sustainability**

- Draft ordinance for full electrification of new residential development –
   FY 2021-22 (\$50,000)
- Prioritize completion of CAAP, discussion of staffing needs to monitor –
   Continue Implementation Phase, included in preliminary budget, Civic
   Spark program for establishing monitoring protocols (\$25,000)
- Aggressively seek funding to expand charging stations throughout the City (public and private facilities) – SCE Grant Program for Civic Center & special funds for possible park locations

# **Environmental Sustainability**

- Consider ordinance banning gas leaf blowers/weed cutting (option to only ban during red flag/high wind/poor air quality days)
- Replace emergency generators to cleaner options completed
- Lid-lock ordinance (reduce rodents and need for rodenticide)

# Land Use/Economic Development

- Complete AVSP Review Included in preliminary budget
- Oak Tree Ordinance Fee Waiver Consider hardship waiver for existing residential (\$10,000)
- Reconsider CBD (non-THC) Delivery/Retail edibles Workshop to discuss all options – FY 2021-22 (\$20,000)
- Review outdoor operation & commercial parking requirements FY
   2021-22 (\$50,000)
- Assist in Business Recovery (Chamber of Commerce or TID) included in FY 2020-21 budget

## Land Use/Economic Development

- Full General Plan Update Consider in next budget cycle
- Oak Tree Ordinance revision
- Ordinance on Short-Term Rentals
- Nuisance Ordinance amended to include outdoor residential lighting and smoking in common areas of multi-family residential
- Update ordinance regarding storing private property on public streets (vehicular parking)

## Emergency Preparedness/Public Safety

- Review emergency response contract services provided through Los Angeles County, look at all options available – FY 2022-23 (\$50,000)
- Flashing lights crosswalk at Reyes Adobe & Stonecrest Apply for
  Highway Safety grant FY 2021-22, construction FY 2022-23, striping &
  signage in preliminary budget for FY 2021-22
- Crosswalk and flashing lights at Reyes Adobe & Rainbowcrest Apply for Highway Safety grant FY 2021-22, construction FY 2022-23
- Educate campaign for public on hardening home/business Education
   via electronic communication unless SB 85 grant awarded

## Emergency Preparedness/Public Safety

- Yellow Flashing Arrows at key intersections
- Crosswalk at Argos & Conejo View
