

During October residents may notice an increase in the number of motor deputies patrolling our streets.

This increase has been made to help protect the streets for all users including pedestrians, cyclists, and drivers.



ార్ Know the Basics Bicycle Safety 🥆

Our streets are full of cyclists getting exercise, training or commuting. Remember our community of cyclists are your mothers, fathers, daughters, sons, friends and neighbors.

Here are some safety tips for sharing the roadways:

- A Be alert and obey all traffic laws.
- A Be prepared to take evasive action relating to vehicles that have just passed you and may turn right, as well as vehicles coming the opposite way that may turn left in front of you.
- A Be prepared to stop for vehicles waiting at stop signs, in driveways, or parking spaces, which may suddenly pull out in front of you.
- ▲ Use hand signals before making turns or changing lanes to warn traffic around you. Always have at least one hand on the handlebars to maintain control of the bike.

Here are five walking safety tips provided by the U.S Department of Transportation:

- A Be predictable. Follow the rules of the road and obey signs and signals.
- A Walk on sidewalks whenever they are available.
- A If there is no sidewalk, walk facing traffic and as far from traffic as possible.
- A Keep alert at all times; don't be distracted by electronic devices that take your eyes (and ears) off the road.
- A Be visible at all times. Wear bright clothing during the day, and wear reflective materials or use a flashlight at night.

Know the Basics Driver Safety

When you are operating a motorized vehicle, you have a responsibility to do your part to keep the roadways safe for yourself, other drivers, passengers, and others who may be affected by traffic accidents such as pedestrians and bicycle users.

- ▲ Buckle Up Wearing your seat belt is an essential safety tip for drivers. Not only are you more likely to get injured in an accident f you aren't wearing a seat belt, you can also be fined for failing to do so.
- **△ Follow Traffic Signals Pay close attention** to and obey stop signs and traffic lights.

- **△ Do Not Text and Drive It is never** acceptable to send texts when operating a motor vehicle.
- ▲ Obey Speed Limits When driving, it's important to stick to the posted speed limit at all times. The restrictions placed on vehicle speed are carefully selected to maximize safety for drivers and for individuals in the homes, businesses, and other organizations in the area.
- A Be Extra Safe in bad Weather When the weather is less than
 perfect, such as rainy, snowy, or foggy
 conditions, use extra precautions when

driving and follow guidelines for staying safe.

- A Never Drive Under the Influence Avoid operating a vehicle if you have
 been drinking, taking certain types
 of prescription or non-prescription
 drugs, or are otherwise impaired.
- A Share the Road Remember that you are not the only driver on the road. An important safety trip that everyone needs to follow is the need to share the road with others graciously, recognizing that all drivers deserve to be treated with respect.

Earthquake Preparedness:Did You Shakeout this Year?

Prepare Before an Earthquake

Each year on the third Thursday of October the world is encouraged to participate in International Shakeout Day to promote earthquake preparedness training. This year's event just happened on October 21st. Did you participate?

This is an important reminder that as residents of Southern California we are at an increased risk for earthquakes to occur in our area. It is important to be prepared in the event of an earthquake. Here are some tips for protecting yourself during and after a potential earthquake:

Stay Safe During

IF AN EARTHQUAKE HAPPENS, PROTECT YOURSELF RIGHT AWAY.

- If you are in a car, pull over and stop. Set your parking brake.
- If you are outdoors, stay outdoors away from buildings.
- If you are inside, stay and do not run outside and avoid doorways.

Stay Safe After

After an earthquake, there can be serious hazards such as damage to the building, leaking gas and water lines, or downed power lines.

- Expect aftershocks to follow the main shock of an earthquake. Be ready to Drop, Cover, and Hold On if you feel an aftershock.
- If you are in a damaged building, go outside and quickly move away from the building. Do not enter damaged buildings.
- Once you are safe, pay attention to local news reports for emergency information and instructions via battery-operated radio, TV, social media or from cell phone text alerts.

Public Safety Power Shutoffs (PSPS) *How to be Prepared*

When there are potentially dangerous weather conditions in fire-prone areas, Southern California Edison may need to call a Public Safety Power Shutoff (PSPS) event.

This event may temporarily shut off power to your neighborhood to prevent their electric system from becoming the source of an ignition. Turning off power to the community is not something that is taken lightly, but PSPS events are one of the ways to better ensure the safety of the public.

Follow these tips in case of potential power shutoffs during the holiday season.

- Install surge protectors to help safeguard electronic equipment
- Familiarize yourself with your home's utility boxes (electricity, water and gas) and how to turn them off; keep the proper tools handy
- Frequently back up important work and files on your computer
- Learn how to manually open your automatic garage doors or gates
- Keep the gas tank in at least one car half full
- You can safely use a portable gas generator in an outdoor location during a power outage - never use it indoors
- Make a safety preparedness plan for your family, including a list and location of the above items and a plan for how pets will be cared for
- Be prepared to meet the special needs of any infant, elderly, or disabled people in your household

Build your own safety kit with the following:

- + FIRST AID KIT
- + PRESCRIPTION MEDICATIONS
- + BOTTLED WATER
- + FLASHLIGHTS & BATTERIES
- + NON-PERISHABLE FOOD
- + SPECIAL-NEEDS ITEMS
 FOR INFANTS
 THE ELDERLY, OR THE DISABLED
- + BATTERY-OPERATED RADIO
- + NON-CORDLESS PHONE

The City of Agoura Hills continues to implement a new mass notification service, ALERT AH to notify residents and businesses of important emergency information.

With ALERT AH, city leaders can send personal voicemail, text, email, and social media platform messages to residents within minutes including specific information about time-sensitive or common-interest issues such as emergencies and local matters.

NOTE: Residents and businesses who signed up to receive mass notification messages under the prior notification system have had that data transferred to the ALERT AH system.

California Redistricting Process Update

Every ten years, after the
U.S. Census, California must
redraw the boundaries of its
Congressional, State Senate,
State Assembly, and State Board
of Equalization districts to reflect
the new population data. In 2021,

the Commission is working to develop and approve the district maps before the final maps are certified to the California Secretary of State.



This is important to our community because fair districts will help to reflect the best interests of the people of our community, not the incumbent politicians.

Input is critical! Speaking up about your community is vital to ensuring district lines are drawn to keep your community whole

to the extent possible, and grouped with nearby communities with similar interests. This ensures that your voice is heard by your elected leaders when making such decisions as the quality and funding of your child's education or determining your tax rates.
