At the September 22, 2010 City Council Meeting, staff presented the City Council with the Cultural Arts Initiative 2010 ("Initiative"). This Initiative was created and developed after Mayor Koehler identified, at the beginning of his term as Mayor, the creation of a cultural arts program as part of his Mayoral Goals. There were different components to the Initiative including the following: the creation of a Cultural Arts Council; creating program branding; developing a cultural arts blueprint; and the creation of a cultural arts society. While each of these aspects of the Initiative is equally important, it was critical to begin with the creation of the Cultural Arts Council ("CAC"). The CAC is going to be a working committee that advises the City Council on critical issues relating to arts and culture in our community.

The open filing period for receipt of the applications for the Cultural Arts Council was during the month of October 2010. The City received many excellent applications and narrowed it down to a select number of individuals to be interviewed by the Community Services Committee and Creative Hub. There were several extremely qualified applicants who verbalized a real desire to be involved with this cultural arts movement. Needless to say, the challenge of selecting the top candidates was difficult. Set forth below are the individuals recommended to serve on the Cultural Arts Council:

For your convenience attached to this report are copies of the applications for the selected individuals.

The individuals selected for the CAC demonstrate the leadership that our community needs in order to fulfill a vision for the arts. It is clear that the primary goal of the CAC will be to create a cultural blueprint for the residents of Agoura Hills and the surrounding communities, which they will be able to participate in for years to come.

The CAC will have an orientation meeting in December 2010, and will officially begin its journey in January 2011.


Aref collectors feel his work goes deeper than the surface and truly holds a sense of inner beauty that represents the wonders of life.

"Aref's work is all about beauty; grace and color which has made him so appealing to collectors worldwide," Le Mendi Gallery of Art UK.

"If I was asked what style best describes my paintings I would have to say that they are a mixture of various techniques that I have taken from several 19th & 20th Century artists. Even though the works of artists such as Picasso have always influenced me, I believe that I have created a distinct style of my own. Abstractism, realism and cubism are very prevalent elements in all my paintings. Mixed together they create an image that is uniquely my own. My paintings usually have a common theme to them, a main character (usually a woman) in the foreground surrounded by many hidden images of musical instruments and still life in the background.

I have been told on numerous occasions that what the audience finds most appealing about my paintings is that they can see it one way today and then see it in a completely different light the next day. There are always new things
